

By-law No.431.

A By-law to erect the unincorporated Village of Malton into a Police Village, and to provide a place to hold the first Election of Police Trustees, and to appoint a Returning Officer.

WHEREAS a Petition has been presented to the Municipal Council of the Municipal Corporation of the County of Peel by the resident ratepayers and inhabitants of the unincorporated Village of Malton praying that a By-law be passed by the Municipal Council of the Municipal Corporation of the County of Peel to erect the said Village into a Police Village.

AND WHEREAS there is a population exceeding one hundred and fifty inhabitants within the area proposed by the said petition for the said Police Village, which said area is hereinafter described by metes and bounds, and forty-one of the ratepayers within the said area have signed the said petition in compliance with the Act and Amendments thereto in such cases made and provided.

NOW THEREFORE the Municipal Corporation of the County of Peel by the Council thereof enacts as follows,-

1. That the Village of Malton comprised within the following bounds and limits, that is to say All and Singular those portions of Lots No.10,11 and 12 in the 7th. Concession of the Township of Toronto Gore, which said portions may be more particularly described as follows, that is to say - Commencing at a point on the Easterly limit of the road allowance between Lots No.10 in the 7th. Concession, Township of Toronto Gore, and Lot No.10 in the 6th. Concession East of Hurontario Street, in the Township of Toronto at a distance of sixty-seven rods from a point where the Easterly limit of the said road allowance intersects the Southerly limit of the road allowance between Lot No.10 and Lot No.11 in the 7th. Concession in the Township of Toronto Gore; Thence along the said Easterly

limit a distance of two hundred and twenty^{two} rods to a point; Thence Easterly parallel to the Northerly limit of the road allowance between Lot No.10 and Lot No.11 in the Seventh Concession of the said Township of Toronto Gore for a distance of forty-two rods to a point; Thence Southerly parallel to the Easterly limits of the road allowance between the Township of Toronto Gore and the Township of Toronto a distance of two hundred and twenty-two rods to a point; Thence Westerly parallel to the Northerly limit of the road allowance between Lots No.10 and Lot No.11 in the 7th. Concession in the Township of Toronto Gore Forty-two rods to the place of beginning. Also ALL and singular those portions of Lots No.10,11 and 12 in the 6th. Concession in the Township of Toronto in the County of Peel East of Hurontario Street, which said last mentioned portions may be more particularly described as follows, namely - Commencing at a point on the Easterly limit of the Road allowance between Lot No.10 in the 7th. Concession, Township of Toronto Gore and Lot No.10 in the 6th. Concession East of Hurontario Street, Township of Toronto at a distance of sixty-seven rods from a point where the Easterly limit of the said last mentioned road allowance intersects with the Southerly limit of the road allowance between Lot No.10 in the 7th. Concession, Township of Toronto Gore, and Lot No.11 in the 7th. Concession of Toronto Gore; Thence Westerly parallel to the Southerly limit of the road allowance between Lots No.10 in the 6th. Concession East of Hurontario Street Township of Toronto, and Lot No.11 in the 6th. Concession East of Hurontario Street, Township of Toronto, for a distance of One hundred and fifty-five rods; Thence Northerly parallel to the Westerly limits of the road allowance between the Township of Toronto Gore and the Township of Toronto a distance of Two hundred and twenty-two rods to a point; Thence Easterly parallel to the Southerly

limit of the road allowance between Lot No.10 and Lot.No.11 in the 6th. Concession East of Hurontario Street, Township of Toronto to a point on the Easterly limit of the Road allowance between the Township of Toronto and the Township of Toronto Gore; Thence Southerly along the Easterly limit of the said last mentioned allowance Two hundred and twenty ^{two} rods to the place of beginning, be and the same is hereby declared a Police Village.

2. And it is further enacted by the authority aforesaid that the first Nomination for the Election of Police Trustee for the said Village shall be held on Monday the 3rd. day of March A.D.1913 between the hour of 1 O'clock P.M. and the hour of 2 O'clock P.M. in the Temperance Hall in the said Village, and that in the case of a Poll being demanded the Poll shall be held on Monday the 10th. day of March A.D.1913, and shall continue open until 5 O'clock in the afternoon and no longer, and that John S.Boyes shall be and he is hereby appointed Returning Officer for holding the said Election, and the first meeting of the said Trustees shall be held in the Temperance Hall in the said Village on Monday the 17th. day of March A.D.1913, at the hour of 12 O'clock noon, and

3. That this By-law shall come into force and take effect from and after the passing thereof.
